Ms. Chambers:

This letter has been prepared to further address the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality's (MDEQ) finding that the proposed NCL landfill does not have adequate on-site screening to restrict offsite view of the landfill and allow for a setback distance of 250' (two hundred, fifty feet) from the property line. As mentioned in paragraph 3, page 2 of Eco-Systems' December 1, 2011 letter to the MDEQ, this letter will provide examples of how the MDEQ has historically interpreted on-site screening adequacy. Please note that the examples are not exhaustive.

The first example is the Big River Landfill in Washington County. An application to reissue this landfill's solid waste permit with modifications is currently under review at the MDEQ and has received draft permits. A portion of the Big River Landfill disposal footprint has been determined by the MDEQ to be appropriate for a 250 foot setback distance to the property line. That portion is described by MDEQ's Rationale for Modification for the Big River Landfill Solid Waste Management Permit (Permit Rationale) as, "...the northeastern boundary where the buffer distance is 250 feet with visual screening along the eastern boundary". Additionally, the Permit Rationale states that "...the facility has demonstrated compliance with the applicable regulation." It appears that MDEQ has determined that the facility has adequate on-site visual screening in the aforementioned area of the property to restrict offsite views of the landfill.

Enclosed with this letter is an aerial photograph with the described area of the landfill shown. Also illustrated are the property lines, disposal area boundary, setback distance and the on-site visual screening. As can be seen from the figure, the on-site visual screening consists of a mature tree-line along the property line. The tree-line ranges in depth from approximately 20' (twenty feet), in the southern portion, to approximately 80' (eighty feet), in the northern portion, with an average depth of approximately 60' (sixty feet). Based upon this one example, it appears that a mature tree-line, along the property line, with an average depth of 60' is adequate in the opinion of MDEQ staff to justify a setback distance to the property line of 250'. This approved on-site visual screening is significantly less than the proposed 150 feet thick natural vegetative screening currently on the NCL site.

The second example is the Leflore County Landfill in Leflore County. This landfill is located on the west side of MS Highway 49 a few miles south of Greenwood, Mississippi and has also been




determined by the MDEQ to be appropriate for a setback distance of 250' from the property line (MS Highway 49). It appears that the MDEQ has determined this facility also has adequate on-site screening to restrict the offsite view of the landfill. Please find the attached photographs of the landfill taken from MS Highway 49 on December 19, 2011. According to the Mississippi Department of Transportation, approximately 3,300 vehicles travel MS Highway 49 in front of the landfill each day. Comparatively, approximately 178 vehicles travel North County Line Road at the proposed NCL Landfill site where a thick vegetative screen currently exists.

These two "adequate on-site screening" examples should be compared to the proposed NCL Landfill's on-site screening as described in the aforementioned letter to the MDEQ dated December 1, 2011. The MDEQ's justification for lack of adequate on-site screening at the proposed NCL Landfill property appears to be inconsistent with the justification utilized for other sites in the State. Furthermore, Eco-Systems would like to restate that there appears to be more than adequate on-site visual screening currently in existence to support the NCL Landfill's proposed 250 foot setback distance. Thus, based upon the MDEQ's current determinations for on-site visual screening, the proposed NCL landfill has demonstrated compliance with the siting criteria setback distance requirement contained in Section III.T.1.d of the Mississippi Nonhazardous Solid Waste Management Regulations for a setback of 250 feet.



Dear Ms. Chambers:

I have been asked by Ms. Charnissa Handy to present comments for the public record regarding the above proposed project.

Ms. Handy is a resident of Madison County and supports the proposed project because she believes additional solid waste disposal capacity is needed for Madison County. Currently, much of the County's disposal needs are handled by the City of Canton Landfill (Canton Landfill). The problem is that the City of Canton Landfill is running out of space and needs to expand if it is to continue to operate. The Canton Landfill received a permit to expand from the Mississippi Environmental Quality Permit Board [Permit Board] to develop additional space back in 2004. Unfortunately, it appears the Canton Landfill expansion cannot go through as planned for a number of reasons, including but not limited to the following:

1. It appears that the greater part of the space the Canton Landfill plans to develop is outside the City of Canton's corporate limits. This is problematic because

(A) expansion outside of the City limits will

violate Mississippi  
Commission on Environmental Quality [MCEQ] Order 4396-02 (April 2,  
2002) that limited the expansion to property within Canton. See  
Order  
4397-02, ¶ 3. A copy of the order is enclosed herewith. And,

(B) expansion outside of the City limits will  
violate the Canton  
Landfill's permit, which provides that the Landfill property is  
"within  
the Canton City limits." See, Permit, §IV. A copy of the Permit  
is  
enclosed.

2. A map prepared by Engineers Allen & Hoshall as part of a  
permit  
application appears to indicated that there are more than 20  
residences  
within one mile of the expansion area. A copy of a map/aerial  
photograph illustrating this issue is attached. A City of Canton  
map  
with the approximate area of the proposed expansion penciled in is  
also enclosed.

In contrast to the problems the proposed Canton expansion appears  
to  
have, the NCL landfill, as currently proposed, appears to meet  
permitting requirements, including the 250' buffer zone  
requirement.

We have additional documents that will be provided as soon as  
copies  
can be obtained.

Dear Ms. Chambers:

I am the Supervisor of Madison County District 4 where the NCL Landfill is proposed. I have been involved in the review and approval process of this landfill for over 15 years.

In the mid to late 1990s when cities and counties were completing their initial long term solid waste plans, counties and MSW landfills were asked to work together by forming solid waste authorities, compacts or alliances so counties could demonstrate their long term solid waste disposal capacity assurance. During the 1990s the BFI Little Dixie Landfill refused to cooperate with Madison County and its long-term solid waste planning. Instead, the BFI Little Dixie Landfill elected to commit to a long-term agreement with the City of Jackson and have the City complete its own solid waste plan.

In 1997 the BFI Landfill reported that it had 6 years of life remaining, and because the landfill declined to cooperate with Madison County in its long-term solid waste planning, Madison County asked the Bilberry family to consider developing its property that was next to the BFI Landfill as a landfill for Madison County's long-term use.

From 1998 until 2003 the Madison County Board of Supervisors exhaustively reviewed and considered the development of a landfill on the Bilberry property. During this time, the County conducted at least 20 public meetings and hired experts to assist the County in its review. The exhaustive review and the prospect of a competing landfill coming to the area brought the BFI Landfill to the negotiating table. The Board was able to negotiate a host agreement that provides Madison County with significant savings and a revenue stream of over \$500,000.00 per year for 30 years. As a result of the Board's review, the Board decided to amend its solid waste plan to allow both the BFI Little Dixie Landfill to expand and the NCL/Bilberry Landfill to move forward.


Madison County's revised solid waste plan ("Plan") called for the NCL Landfill to have 103 acres of disposal capacity. This Plan amendment for the 103 acres of disposal capacity was approved by the Commission in 2004. If the Department now imposes a property line setback greater than 500 feet then the permitted acreage will only be about 33 acres of capacity instead of 103 acres. If this was the intent of the Commission in 2004 to reduce the permitted area of the landfill, the Commission should have sent the Plan amendment request back to the Madison County Board of Supervisors for its review and consideration. According to State Law neither the Commission nor the Department can modify a County's solid waste plan request. Legally, in regard to a solid waste plan amendment request, the Commission can only approve it, deny it or send the request back to the county with deficiencies.

Additionally, as long as it conforms to MDEQ regulations which it does so in reference to visual screening, the property line setback should be an issue for the local county government. The 250 foot proposed property line setback of the NCL Landfill is 5 times greater than the setback of the BFI Landfill that is nearest to the NCL Landfill. Madison County has zoning regulations and the 250 foot property line setback of the NCL Landfill not only complies with this regulation but also was specifically approved by the Madison County Board in 2010 after a public hearing on the matter.

As a county supervisor, the politics of garbage is that everyone wants you to pick the garbage up but nobody wants you to put it down. It is a very tough decision to approve a new or expanded landfill. Madison County Board of Supervisors has dutifully and painstakingly followed the law to amend its Plan to include the NCL Landfill. It appears now that Department is trying to make new laws, regulations or obstacles to make it harder for some counties and smaller independent businesses to comply.

As the Supervisor of Madison County District 4 where the NCL Landfill is proposed, I am requesting that the approved Madison County Solid Waste Management Plan be respected in regard to 103 acres disposal capacity approved by the Commission in 2004, affirmed in 2005, affirmed by Appeal Court Judge Lutz presiding in 2010 and affirmed by the Supreme Court in 2011; and, that the property line setback of no more than 250 feet as approved by the Madison County Board of Supervisors as a result of a site plan review and public hearing on the matter in February 2010 be respected and accepted by MDEQ and the Permit Board.

The City of Ridgeland recognizes the importance of the North County Line Road landfill as a critical component of future growth and economic stability.


Ridgeland, through a very carefully considered process, has participated in the Madison County Solid Waste Management Plan, and concern over the true remaining capacity at the two other landfills has been an item of discussion on a number of occasions.

The City of Ridgeland, along with other area municipalities, is looking at future requirements for solid waste disposal contracts and the competitiveness of other options available. Without the NCL landfill, the rates available to us, thereby passed on to our residents and businesses would negatively impact growth and development. Additionally, the NCL project is a locally owned and operated business.

The NCL site, conveniently adjacent to the existing landfill properties, will also create new jobs. The county will also benefit from additional revenue. Ridgeland, along with Madison and Flora, approved this landfill as a part of the Madison County Solid Waste Management Plan around 2003. Dear Ms. Chambers,

As a resident of Madison County, I am in favor of the NCL/Bilberry landfill and believe this effort now in progress is reasonable planning for the future growth of the county. As a citizen involved in county economic development, I believe that this landfill would do no harm; it has been widely discussed and examined. Madison County continues to enjoy steady growth in its businesses and number of residents. A necessary consideration as we plan for continued future growth is waste disposal.

BFI's current landfill capacity has been subject to various studies and determinations; regardless of what "life expectancy" it is given, it will one day become full. The proposed NCL/Bilberry site, which is in between BFI's two existing properties, will increase Madison County's ability to dispose of its own waste.

By opening a third landfill, Madison County is not becoming the "dumping ground" for Central Mississippi; Madison County is responsibly looking into future needs of its residents, and also at the future needs of surrounding metropolitan areas who have to contract for their waste disposal.

For four terms, and now entering a fifth, the Madison County Board of Supervisors has completed the required measures to bring this project to fruition. This latest confusion over the "setback" requirements is one cleared up and outlined in MDEQ's own guidelines: 250 feet is more than adequate considering the remote location on North County Line Road, and also considering the thick growth of trees and vegetation which effectively screen the Bilberry property.

Recognition is due to all those whose hard work and planning put forth for this project. Although I am writing to support this project as a private citizen, it is my experience as a past Chairman and current board member of the Madison County Economic Development Authority that gives me perspective in

appreciating how Madison County is working towards the betterment of all its citizens, and in support of the development of businesses so crucial to our economic stability.

MDEQ should allow the permits to be issued for this necessary landfill project without further delay.

Dear Mr Chambers

According to the area waste plans, more landfill space is needed.

BFI's report is inaccurate and has been allowed to claim that its capacity as increased. MDEQ testified in 2004 that BFI had 14 years of capacity. In 2005 BFI reports at MDEQ show BFI took in more waste, but instead of showing less than 13 years of capacity, BFI reported 20 years..

The Canton Landfill claims to have 70 permitted acres available. However, earlier this year when Jackson Jambalaya posted a copy of Canton's annexation lawsuit on its website, it showed that 60 acres of the Canton Landfill's undeveloped acreage is actually in Madison County. Since Canton didn't ask Madison County to amend its solid waste plan to include the area, the permit was issued illegally. MDEQ is investigating this matter.

There is also a question how much farther BFI can expand vertically and whether some of the property BFI plans to use was actually permitted in compliance with the law. BFI's special exception to Madison County zoning regulations limit the height of the BFI landfill to 500 feet and it is believed BFI's expansion would exceed that.

The owner of the NCL property is Michael Bilberry. What must be recognized is that the State of Mississippi permitted landfills on the northern and southern boundaries of his property, and a high powered transmission line on his eastern border. In 2008 Hinds County zoned land for a class 1 landfill across the road from Mr. Bilberry even though it was at the Supreme Court opposing Mr. Bilberry and submitting testimony it didn't want landfills on North County Line Road.

Other features in the immediate area of the NCL property are two industrial construction plants and about 7 homes. The majority of these homeowners that MDEQ wanted Madison County to meaningful involve support the landfill. The ones who don't refused to meet with the company and discuss concerns. Some of the odors complained about are likely raw sewerage from a No one made an issue of



this, however when the Permit Board considers the complaints of odors from this opponent, it can't be overlooked.

MDEQ's legal division has stated it has been acting on the Order approving the Madison County Solid Waste Plan Amendment and the 100 acre landfill on Mr. Bilberry's property.

it's been going by a Commission on Environmental Quality Order that approved the Madison County The Order request the Permit Board consider and review a 500 foot setback.

**What MDEQ overlooks is that the request was based on there being sufficient acreage and misleading information from DEQ staff.**

I was at the 2004 meeting. It shows a Commission member asked DEQ staff what the state requirements were on setbacks. The regulations state, *For landfills, the setback shall be at least 500 feet. EXCEPT where adequate on-site screening, whether natural or artificial, will restrict the offsite view of the landfill, in which case the setback shall be no less than 250 feet.*

But instead of stating this, the DEQ staff member stated "*in the Environmental Permitting Process there is a buffer zone that is required of them, they don't have to agree to it, it's required, it's a 500 foot setback distance from the property line to the edge of the disposal area.*"

That is not the regulation and law. Having seen actual photos of the dense vegetative screen at the previous months meeting the Commissioner attempted to ask the DEQ staffer about the setback for vegetative screens. However, before she could ask the question, the DEQ staffer told her what she was referring to and proceeded to answer his own question and with more inaccurate information

The Commissioners are lay citizens, much like a school board. They rely on MDEQ staff. When the Commissioner made the recommendation for the permit board to

to review a greater setback, it was based on the premise there was sufficient acreage, i.e. "*seeing as the acreage is so large.*" "

The Executive Director intervened. While he graciously applauded "*the spirit of the request*" he made clear that *for the integrity of the process, the Commission and the Permit Board remain separate, independent entities.*

Mr. Chisolm tried to tell the Commissioner such a request wasn't appropriate. At the evidentiary hearing MDEQ's legal division confirmed this. In fact, prior to the vote, the MDEQ's legal division didn't say 500 feet, but state regulations.

On May 20, 2011, MDEQ using the Commission's Order wrote NCL and halted the processing of NCL's permit because it was not submitted with a 500 ft. setback. However, a transcript of the Commissioners actual request shows she had not intention of her request being used in such a manner. In fact, the Commissioner actually stated, "*I move we accept it and let it move through the permit process, along with a recommendation that the permit board review the buffer zone and increase it to more than 500 feet seeing as the acreage is so large ...*".

On November 16, MDEQ sent NCL a letter stating the buffer was "inadequate," causing NCL to write back and ask for MDEQ's official guidelines, policies and procedures used to determine the adequacy of a buffer. NCL screen is so dense the record shows NCL displayed photos of the screen at the Commission meeting in 2004 as a positive feature of the proposed landfill. The Commission had no objections. These photos are likely what prompted Commissioner's aforementioned attempted question regarding the setback for screened landfill's that the MDEQ staff had failed to cite.

MDEQ portrays NCL's 250 ft setback as a request for a reduced setback. The 250 ft setback is neither a request or reduced. It's the law. As previous mentioned, the law states "*... where adequate on-site screening, whether natural or artificial, will restrict the offsite view of the landfill, ... the setback shall be no less than 250 feet.*" The "shall be" means it's the law. The 250 ft setback and the 500



ft setback are two distinct requirements, exclusive and having no relation to the other.

MDEQ's BFI landfill inspection reports states that BFI has established and maintained a 500-foot buffer screen, although there is not a tree in sight.

When the Commissioner in 2004 tried to ask about vegetative setbacks she was interrupted. Mr. Williams told her

MARK WILLIAMS: Well what you're referring to is, if there is, they can request an exclusion to that setback distance be reduced, but if they request that, they have to have a visual screen, something that's visual screening of the landfill, on that side where the reduced buffer is. So if they reduce the buffer from 500 ft to 250 ft. they have to have visual screening there that would prevent site of the landfill operation. But that is primarily done as a part of the permit process. and that hasn't really been agreed upon or talked about or part of the review of the planning matter.

I do not know the regulations that states that. However, if true the landfill in Leflore County couldn't have been permitted. It is not screened by trees that block the view and it its request for a setback was 110 to 142 feet. The County was very lax in how it notified adjacent property owners.

I am submitting a copy of Leflore County landfill documents for the record, for Mr. Bryant Clark, who represents residents. Also attached is a Google photo. Mr. Clark said he has yet to receive how MDEQ terms the adequacy of screens.

I also would like entered into the record the attached documents regarding MDEQ's policy on timelines.

In closing Ms. Dalrymple said review the greater setback, when making the recommendation in 2004. That is different from consider.

Mr. Chisolm allowed the recommendation because of the Spirit of the request. The definition of a Spirit is: *Incorporeal consciousness*. In comeans lacking material form or substance. Consciousness: state of *being aware* of something especially *within oneself*

Recommend means to *advise*. Review means look over examine.

By putting the recommendation in the Order, with the wrong law as the basis for the setback, it was no longer In Spirit. It was *embodied*. As such, the Spirit of the recommendation took on the form of a petition.

When something can't be resolves, it's because there constituent parts.

Follow me here. Constituent - he who gives authority to another to act for him.  
(Farlex free legal dictionary.

The Commission, who is charged with the enforcing the State of Mississippi's environmental laws, granted the authority of the siting criteria to the Permit Board.

The Commission is bound by whatever the Permit Board does by virtue of the authority granted it and which has built DEQ's integrity.

The Permit Board with the Commissions approval, established the setback for landfills with a natural or artificial screen, at 250 feet.

Further, the Commission had granted the authority to local governments for planning for the management of solid waste.



It was stated then that DEQ had maintained its integrity by keeping the duties of the Commission and Permit Board separate. That's why the recommendation for a greater setback was not embodied but allowed in Spirit.

I know the trees are dense and I know the law says 250.

It was for the people I worked with in 2004 that Mrs. Dalrymple was concerned.

They would best be served by permitting NCL.

Reference your letter of August 23, 1993, regarding your review of the landfill permit application we submitted on behalf of the Leflore County Board of Supervisors. This letter forwarded a set of specific questions regarding the drawings and documents submitted to you by us in May 1993. It also forwarded guidance information of permit application development; which has been subsequently superseded by state and federal documents you have since given me.

As you are aware, several things have occurred regarding the landfill since this letter was sent. Most importantly, at a meeting in January 1994 between you, your staff, and myself, several design changes were specified that necessitated a complete redesign of the facility. These changes resulted from your informing me that: 1) the proposed method of removing leachate from the cells would not be supported by your office during the permitting process, 2) that the geometry of the leachate collection system was not going to be acceptable, and 3) that we would be allowed to alter the cover design to use an intermediate cover system having a surface slope of three horizontal to one vertical until such time that we reached the permitted height after which the final synthetic and earthen cover would be installed. As you will also recall, during that meeting I was given new (i.e., dated January 1994 and marked draft) guidance documents on state landfill requirements. Later, during a brief visit in mid-February, you were able to give me a copy of the recently-distributed federal guidance document on design, operation, and closure of landfills.

It has come to my attention that there may be some confusion on the status of our response to the above referenced letter. I apologize for this and can only surmise that it has resulted from my failure to formally transmit via cover letter the data and drawings submitted to date. I am therefore writing to summarize the status of the application and associated documentation.

Let me start by saying that the incorporation of the design changes into the drawings obvious took some time as did obtaining the appropriate technical review for some of the specific questions. Further, development of the operation and closure/post-closure plans could not be adequately addressed until the facility design was finished and all guidance documents were reviewed. In general, this work is concluded, or will be shortly. However, regarding the 15 specific comments dated August 20, 1993, the following summary is provided; numbered in conformance with the numbers assigned each question:

1. This clarification will be provided in the documents to be resubmitted shortly. However, let me assure you that the names and addresses provided correspond directly with those on the property map provided in May 1993. But, for clarity we will provide the desired correlation in tabular form in our next submission.

Regarding adjacent property owners, please note that in many ways the County is the adjacent property owner. If you inspect property map to delineate land adjacent to the site, most of it is County-owned. Many of the names provided previously are actually adjacent to the County's land which is in turn adjacent to the landfill site. The site location drawings have been revised to provide some clarification of these facts. These changes were incorporated in the drawings which you received a few weeks ago.

2. The failure to submit the signature of the applicant was an oversight on my part. Though it would have been a simple matter to have had the authorized agents of the Leflore County Board of Supervisors sign this form during any of the meetings you and they have had since May, I elected to hold a copy of this document for inclusion in a comprehensive document re-submission. To date, this sheet has been signed by the authorized agents of the Leflore County Board of Supervisors and will be forwarded shortly as part of the documentation re-submission.
3. As I indicated in our January meeting, all landowners have been approached on a personal level by representatives of the County Supervisors. Each property owner, and their legal representative(s), is aware of the project and have stated no objection to date. Further, the Supervisors routinely meet individually with these individuals and keep them apprised of the project. Additional information is made available to them by local newspaper and television via public access coverage of Board meetings dealing with the landfill.

Based on our previous conversations, I have assumed this level and type of "informal" notification is acceptable and sufficient; especially given the fact that the County is actually the primary adjacent landowner as summarized in 1. above.

4. Regarding the eastern property setback, as we have discussed, the highway setback subscribes to the requirements for land which has been designated for industrial use. The proposed site is part of a designated County industrial park. We indicated the visual screening plan on the May 1993 drawings. The property on the eastern side of the road is owned by the County.

Regarding the southern setback, we have had verbal assurance that the proposed setback will be acceptable. However, the death of a principal in this parcel necessitated a delay in obtaining this agreement in written form. This delay is rapidly nearing an end and a copy of the final executed agreement will be included in the resubmitted documentation, per your stipulation.

5. This documentation could not be developed until final design was complete. I am currently

concluding the appropriate calculation to illustrate capacity assurance is provided by this system. As we have discussed, there is some consideration being given to going to a baling operation. Though such an operation is not required for capacity assurance, the increase in capacity resulting from this will also be projected with the documents as a possible, future alternative operating program. Hopefully this will eliminate the administrative problems that might arise if such a process were to be used in the future.

Regarding the host and generating jurisdiction, this is Leflore County. The County has an approved Solid Waste Management Plan (SWMP) and the plan includes a waste minimization program. It would seem anticipated that coordination of this facility with the SWMP would occur, but we have every intention of providing the certification as stipulated.

6. As indicated in the May 1993 documents, the appropriate federal and state authorities have been contacted. The original letters are in our file. We will be happy to submit copies of these letters, in the near future, as part of a comprehensive document re-submission.
7. The May 1993 documents indicate that the site is part of an industrial use area set aside by Leflore County. The drawings indicated the visual screening program initially proposed. With the revisions to the site layout which have been necessitated by the comments and information provided by you subsequent to our original submission, minor changes in site aesthetics and visual screening have been effected. However, the basis concept remains unchanged and is presumed acceptable based on previous conversations with you and your staff. These changes are reflected in the drawings submitted to your office a few weeks ago.
8. The set of questions relate to geotechnical/geological/hydrogeological data were addressed in Addenda No. 1 (dated December 15, 1993) to the Springer Engineering, Inc. geotechnical report. Two copies of this report were forwarded around the first of the year.
9. This set of questions, which relate to the groundwater monitoring plan, was also addressed in Addenda No. 1 to the Springer Engineering, Inc. report as already forwarded.
10. This set of questions relate to site excavation and was also addressed in Addenda No. 1 to the Springer Engineering, Inc. report as already forwarded. Please note that Cells No. 2 and 3 have been combined as Cell No. 2 on the drawings recently re-submitted.

As part of our review of this response and the supporting documents, we defined an area of additional concern. Because this determination was made using data from one boring, the magnitude of this problem, if any, can not be readily quantified. Rather, the area has been delineated on the excavation drawings which you now have as an area requiring special attention and monitoring during construction.

11. The modification of the operating plan and the development of the closure plan are nearing





completion. As you can imagine, the degree to which the facility layout and design have changed significantly delayed preparation of these documents. Further, continued development and refinement of state and federal guidance tended to slow this process. The quality assurance and control (QA/QC) plan is being developed. I have solicited independent input and review of the geotechnical portion of the QA/QC plan. This should be complete by mid-week.

12. The changes in intermediate and final cover design, as we have discussed previously, have been incorporated in to the current drawings, which you now have.
13. As illuded to above, all previously-supplied state and federal guidance information has been reviewed and the facility operation and documentation will subscribe to the appropriate closure requirements.
14. Cost estimates are currently being completed and were obviously delayed by design considerations. It is anticipated that the County will subscribe to the currently-proposed self assurance requirements. Initially, the bonding and revenue capacity of the County will be used to provide the needed cost coverage.
15. These unrelated comments either have been addressed in the drawings which you received recently, and/or will be addressed in the comprehensive document re-submission which is imminent.

I anticipate completion of the additional research and calculations by the end of this week. Therefore, we should be ready to make our document re-submission within a short time. Again, I am sorry for any confusion my lack of formal communication with you may have caused. I hope to meet with you soon to present you with the last of the materials needed to allow this project to proceed.

The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality ("MDEQ") is in receipt of your letter dated November 12, 2010, requesting an evidentiary hearing regarding the Mississippi Commission on Environmental Quality's approval of the Hinds County Solid Waste Management Plan as expressed in Administrative Order No. 5844 10. The request was filed on behalf of Don Glenn, Don Kazery, and other members of Citizens Against the Landfill. Miss. Code Ann. § 49-17-41 specifically provides in part "... any person or interested party aggrieved by any order of the commission or the executive director shall have a right to file a sworn petition with the commission within thirty (30) days after the order was issued setting forth the grounds and reasons for his complaint and asking for a hearing of the matter involved ...". The request for a hearing was received over thirty (30) days after the order was issued as Administrative Order No. 5844 10 was issued on October 11, 2010. Your request for a hearing was not timely as it was made on November 12, 2010, which is thirty-two (32) days after the order was issued.

Additionally, your correspondence was not provided as a sworn petition as required by Miss. Code Ann. § 49-17-41. Further, your letter challenges the inclusion of the Faireloth Class I Rubbish Site in the Hinds County Solid Waste Management Plan, but it is the position of MDEQ that the Faireloth Class I Rubbish Site has been an existing part of the Hinds County Solid Waste Management Plan since 1993 and therefore is not subject to a challenge pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. § 49-17-41. MDEQ's position related to the Faireloth Rubbish Site was previously expressed in MDEQ's letter to Don Glenn dated June 22, 2010, a copy of which is enclosed. MDEQ's letter dated June 22, 2010,


also indicates Mr. Glenn did not timely challenge the previous Administrative Order No. 5694 09 related to this matter.

Since the request for an evidentiary hearing was not timely, a sworn petition was not submitted, and the request challenges a facility recognized since 1993 as existing in the Hinds County Solid Waste Management Plan, your submittal does not comply with Miss. Code Ann. § 49-17-41.

As you are aware, an evidentiary hearing regarding the reissuance of Solid Waste Management Permit SW0250020548 to Faireloth Landfill, Inc. is scheduled before the Mississippi Environmental Quality Permit Board on May 10, 2011. Since there are legal flaws related to the request for an evidentiary hearing as expressed herein, MDEQ believes the cleanest and most efficient manner for your clients to proceed with the challenge to the Faireloth Class I Rubbish Site is to focus on the upcoming Permit Board evidentiary hearing scheduled for May 10.

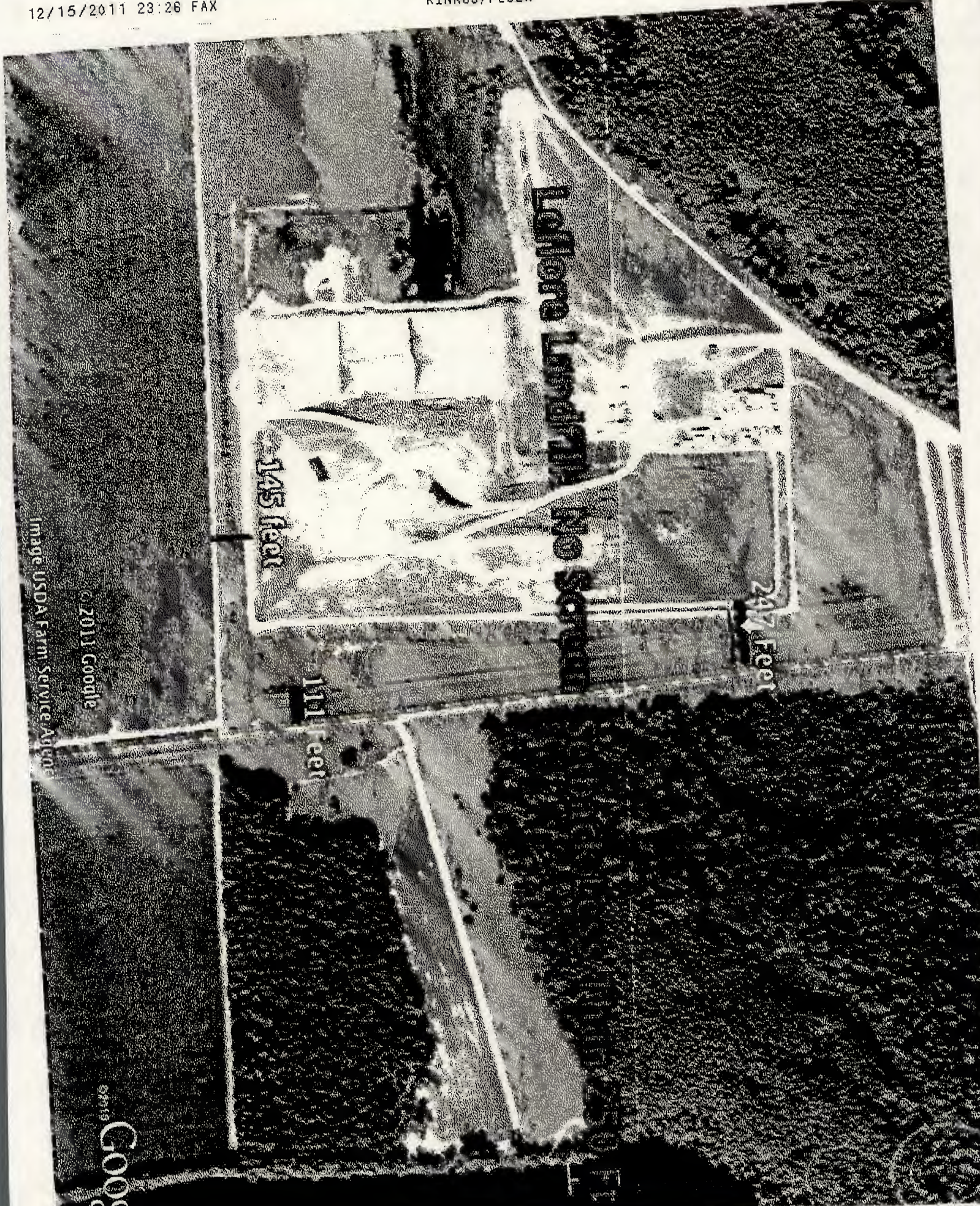

The City of Ridgeland recognizes the importance of the North County Line Road landfill as a critical component of future growth and economic stability.


Ridgeland, through a very carefully considered process, has participated in the Madison County Solid Waste Management Plan, and concern over the true remaining capacity at the two other landfills has been an item of discussion on a number of occasions.

The City of Ridgeland, along with other area municipalities, is looking at future requirements for solid waste disposal contracts and the competitiveness of other options available. Without the NCL landfill, the rates available to us, thereby passed on to our residents and businesses would negatively impact growth and development. Additionally, the NCL project is a locally owned and operated business.

The NCL site, conveniently adjacent to the existing landfill properties, will also create new jobs. The county will also benefit from additional revenue. Ridgeland, along with Madison and Flora, approved this landfill as a part of the Madison County Solid Waste Management Plan around 2003. Not only has the Madison County Board of Supervisors acted on every item put forth by the Permit Board, it has consistently voted in favor of it. The technicality of the setback now under consideration is not something that should stop this project from moving forward, especially since the other facilities do not meet the current MDEQ requirement for 250 feet; in fact, in several areas along the perimeters of the other existing landfills, there is almost no setback or vegetative screen at all. The Bilberry property has more than adequate trees and other foliage to screen the landfill as required for this permit.

Additionally, the plan for the North County Line project meets all environmental requirements and provides greatly needed space for future solid waste management planning.

As a resident of Madison County, I am in favor of the NCL/Bilberry landfill and believe this effort now in progress is reasonable planning for the future growth of the county. As a citizen involved in county economic development, I believe that this landfill would do no harm; it has been widely discussed and examined. Madison County continues to enjoy steady growth in its businesses and number of residents. A necessary consideration as we plan for continued future growth is waste disposal.

BFI's current landfill capacity has been subject to various studies and determinations; regardless of what "life expectancy" it is given, it will one day become full. The proposed NCL/Bilberry site, which is in between BFI's two existing properties, will increase Madison County's ability to dispose of its own waste.

By opening a third landfill, Madison County is not becoming the "dumping ground" for Central Mississippi; Madison County is responsibly looking into future needs of its residents, and also at the future needs of surrounding metropolitan areas who have to contract for their waste disposal.
