This seventh amendment to Mississippi's Multiyear Implementation Plan (MIP) modifies twelve projects previously accepted on the Initial MIP and subsequent amendments (Activities 1, 11, 17, 18, 21, 23, 29, 30, 36, 38, 39, and 41), which are only modified to the extent described below. Projects may start earlier or later than the proposed start dates depending on the availability of funds and readiness of the project.

Activity #1: Stennis International Airport Hangar (Modified)

This Project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP. Project activities are complete, and the grant award has been closed.

Project Modification: Amendment #7 modifies the project budget to reflect the total funds expended of \$2,111,955.16. The grant is closed. The accepted Initial MIP can be found at the following link: [Initial MIP](#).

Activity #11: Planning Assistance – MIP Amendment and Application Development (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's Initial MIP to provide planning assistance to support the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) in the development of multiple MIP amendments. MDEQ has received a planning assistance award from the U.S. Department of the Treasury (Treasury) for this project. The proposed project modification includes an increase in funding for this project to support MDEQ in the development of future MIP amendments and applications. There is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #6.

Project Modification: This project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$500,000. This increase in funding is needed to support MDEQ's development of future MIP amendments and other activities under this project's scope of work described in the Initial MIP and MIP Amendments #1-6, which is consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, and Success Criteria previously accepted by Treasury. Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will be used to provide planning assistance for the identification and evaluation of projects, programs, and activities and the development of MIP amendments, as needed. Direct Component funds will also be used for activities associated with grant application development for projects on the accepted MIP, project oversight and management activities, and the development, coordination, and execution grant awards between MDEQ and Treasury. No other funding sources are anticipated at this time.

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #1 and subsequently modified under MIP Amendment #3 and Amendment #5. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with the Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention Center for implementation. There is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #1.

Project Modification: The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$1,815,000 to support site improvements described in MIP Amendment #1, which is consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, and Success Criteria previously accepted by Treasury. Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Additional Direct Component funds will be used in support of design, permitting, implementation of site improvements. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the subrecipient. The Mississippi Coast Coliseum Commission is contributing \$280,000 in third-party funds for the project.

MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with the City of Biloxi for implementation. There is no modification to the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in Mississippi's MIP Amendment #4.

Project Modification: The project description is being modified to include dredging of accumulated sediment in the marina area. The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$5,500,000 and third-party funding by \$5,534,840.50 to support implementation of additional infrastructure improvements consistent with the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, and Success Criteria previously accepted by Treasury. Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will be used to support implementation/construction of Point Cadet Marina infrastructure upgrades, dredging and activities such as planning, engineering and design, and permitting. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities and the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury and sub-award between MDEQ and the subrecipient. The City of Biloxi is contributing \$5,534,840.50 in third-party funds for the project.

MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with the City of Moss Point for implementation. There is no modification to the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, Success Criteria, or Project Budget as outlined and accepted in Mississippi's MIP Amendment #6.

Project Modification: The project description is being modified to expand the project area to include improvements to the north of Interstate 10 between Trehern Street and Highway 63, which is part of the City's Master Plan for the project area. Of note, funding under this award will only be used in areas south of Interstate 10, consistent with previous MIP Amendments. Project activities are consistent with the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, Success Criteria, and Project Budget previously accepted by Treasury. Amount and Current Status of Funding From Other Sources: Direct Component funds will support the implementation of the construction of roadway infrastructure improvements and associated activities such as planning, engineering, design, and permitting. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the subrecipient. No other funding sources are anticipated at this time.

This activity will be implemented by the City of Moss Point and will comply with the definition of infrastructure in 31 C.F.R. §34.2.

Activity #36: Gulfport-Biloxi Airport Site Mitigation and Improvements (Modified)

This project was accepted under Mississippi's MIP Amendment #5 and subsequently modified under MIP Amendment #6. MDEQ has received a grant award from Treasury for this project, and MDEQ has executed a sub-award agreement with the Gulfport-Biloxi Regional Airport Authority for implementation. There is no modification to the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #6.

Project Modification: The project description is being modified to include construction of an aircraft Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) facility, complete with an associated apron and taxi lane. Additional activities necessary to complete this proposed project modification may include, but are not limited to, construction site preparation and construction. The project budget is being modified to increase the Direct Component funding by \$6,600,000 and third-party funding by \$4,600,000. Project activities are consistent with the Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, and Success Criteria previously accepted by Treasury. Direct Component funds will also be used for project oversight and management activities; the development, coordination, and execution of the grant award between MDEQ and Treasury; and the development, coordination, and execution of the sub-award between MDEQ and the subrecipient. Gulfport-Biloxi International Airport is contributing \$4,600,000 in third-party funds for the project.

- Documentation (e.g., a copy of public notices) to demonstrate that the entity made its multiyear implementation plan available to the public for at least 45 days;
- A copy of all meaningful public comments received (OGCR defines “meaningful” as all comments pertaining to the selection of each activity (projects and programs) or the approach to or design of any proposed activities (projects and program));
- Any responses provided to meaningful public comments;
- A list of changes made as a result of meaningful public comments. If critical comments were received but no changes were made, the entity should explain why incorporating these comments is infeasible or not in keeping with the public interest; and
- A letter from the applicant's leadership approving submission of the multiyear implementation plan to Treasury or a resolution approving the applicant's multiyear implementation plan.

The projects were prioritized using the following:

1. Mississippi utilized three stakeholder-driven components to identify and prioritize all projects for inclusion in MIP Amendment #7: Stakeholder Meetings; The Governor’s Gulf Coast Advisory Committee (GCAC); and the Restoration Project Idea Portal. Items (a) through (e) below provide further explanation for the GCAC process:

(a) Governor Tate Reeves created the GCAC to serve as an advisory body to the Governor for recommendation of projects to be funded for Mississippi under the RESTORE Act.

(b) The GCAC is comprised of over 70 engaged stakeholders, including private citizens, non-governmental organizations, business owners, elected officials, and other community leaders from the Mississippi Coast.

(c) The GCAC formed seven sub-committees that focused on seven key areas related to the activities specified in the RESTORE Act (Eco-restoration, Economic Development, Infrastructure, Seafood, Small Business, Tourism, and Workforce Development/Research & Education).

(d) On April 3, 2023, MDEQ released a public “call for projects” soliciting project ideas from the public for funding consideration on this amended MIP.

(e) On April 25, 2023, Governor Reeves convened the GCAC to begin selection of recommended projects for this amended MIP. Each sub-committee member was sent a list of projects previously selected for funding within their respective category and provided a list of remaining portal projects related to their respective committee category.

(e) The GCAC sub-committees met, and each produced a list of recommended projects for submittal to the Governor’s office. After deliberation, the Governor selected projects to fund.

Each of the projects identified in MIP Amendment #7 were developed and informed directly from a project (or projects) submitted in the Restoration Project Idea Portal.

Additionally, MDEQ completed due diligence activities on each project to evaluate constructability, feasibility, logistics, eligibility determinations, and environmental compliance reviews to confirm recommended projects could be funded by the Direct Component of the RESTORE Act.

2. All projects included in MIP Amendment #7 are eligible for RESTORE Act funding under the Direct Component eligible activities for: infrastructure projects benefitting the economy or ecological resources; and planning assistance.

Mississippi Governor Tate Reeves announced the amended MIP on October 19, 2023. The Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) also announced the amended MIP at the 2023 Restoration Summit in Biloxi, MS. During the 2023 Restoration Summit, MDEQ representatives presented project information to the public. Vietnamese and Spanish translation services were available. On January 31, 2024, MDEQ published its amended MIP for public review and comment. A notice was published in the Sun Herald and Clarion-Ledger newspapers informing the public that the amended MIP was available for public review and comment. An email blast was also sent to those registered to receive notices. This amended MIP was made available for public review and comment for a total of 47 days, from January 31, 2024, until March 18, 2024. The amended MIP and a corresponding map were available to the public, directly downloadable, through www.restore.ms, and were also available upon request via email, fax, telephone, or mail directly from MDEQ. The amended MIP was available in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese upon request. Documentation to demonstrate that this MIP Amendment #7 was made available for public comment for at least 45 days is attached as Exhibit B.

MDEQ accepted public comments and input electronically via www.restore.ms, as well as via email, fax, telephone, or mail directly to MDEQ. On February 29, 2024 and March 11, 2024, MDEQ delivered an email blast to remind those registered to receive notices that the public review and comment period for the amended MIP would close on March 18, 2024. A final email blast was delivered on March 18, 2024, as a reminder that the public review and comment period for the amended MIP would close on March 18, 2024.

During the public review and comment period, MDEQ received a total of four (4) sets of written comments. No other public comments were submitted. All comments have been summarized for purposes of this response. A copy of all meaningful public comments received is attached as Exhibit C. All comments submitted during the public review and comment period were reviewed and considered by MDEQ. Each activity in the amended MIP was adopted after consideration of meaningful input from the public. Changes made as a result of meaningful comments are included below.

This document includes the following sections:

Section 1: Comments on Specific Projects on Amended MIP

SECTION 1: COMMENTS ON SPECIFIC PROJECTS ON AMENDED MIP

MDEQ received a comment from the U.S. Department of the Treasury requesting more information on Activity #17: Mississippi Coast Coliseum and Convention Center Site Capacity Improvements Project Modification: Specify exactly what site improvements are intended to be made with the additional funds so the public can meaningfully comment and understand how these improvements will benefit the economy.

This activity was originally proposed in MIP Amendment #1 and included the Project Summary, Need, Purpose, Objective, Eligibility Criteria, Location, Budget, Milestones, Projected Completion Dates and Success Criteria. As stated in MIP Amendment #1, "Improvements may include infrastructure improvements or costs associated with land acquisition to support additional amenities". On July 5, 2017, Treasury accepted MIP Amendment #1

confirming that MIP Amendment #1 was complete and conformed to the RESTORE Act and regulations. MIP Amendment #3, accepted by Treasury on June 19, 2019, and MIP Amendment #5, accepted by Treasury on May 12, 2022, modified this activity by increasing the amount of Direct Component contributed to the activity described and accepted on MIP Amendment #1. This MIP Amendment is adding funds to the previously accepted project as described and accepted in MIP Amendment #1, and this MIP Amendment states that there is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #1. In response to this comment, MDEQ has revised the Project Modification to remove the word “additional” in order to clarify that the additional funds will support site improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose and Objective described and accepted in MIP Amendment #1.

MDEQ received a comment requesting more information on Activity #30: City of Moss Point Interstate 10 Commercial Corridor Improvements Project Modification: Specify exactly what “additional roadway improvements” are intended to be made with the additional funds so the public can meaningfully comment and understand how these improvements will benefit the economy.

This activity was originally proposed on MIP Amendment #4 and included the Project Summary, Need, Purpose, Objective, Eligibility Criteria, Location, Budget, Milestones, Projected Completion Dates and Success Criteria. As stated in MIP Amendment #4, “public roadway improvements would include activities such as intersection improvements and realignment, installation of traffic signal(s), existing roadway widening and construction of connections between existing roadways”. On April 27, 2020, Treasury accepted MIP Amendment #4 confirming that MIP Amendment #4 was complete and conformed to the RESTORE Act and regulations. MIP Amendment #5, accepted by Treasury on May 12, 2022, modified this activity to specify the roadways identified for improvement and increased the amount of Direct Component funds contributed to the activity described and accepted on MIP Amendment #4. MIP Amendment #6, accepted by Treasury on May 2, 2023, modified this activity by expanding the project area and increasing the amount of Direct Component funds contributed to the activity. This MIP Amendment states the Project Description is being modified to further expand the project area beyond the locations described in MIP Amendment #5. In response to this comment, MDEQ has revised the Project Modification to describe the expanded project area and clarify that project activities are consistent with previously accepted MIP Amendments. Specifically, MDEQ added “to expand the project area to include improvements north of Interstate 10 between Trehern Street and Highway 63, which is part of the City’s Master Plan for the project area. Of note, funding under this award will only be used in areas south of Interstate 10, consistent with previous MIP Amendments. Project activities are consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose and Objective as accepted on MIP Amendments 4, 5 and 6.” MDEQ revised the Project Modification to remove “include additional roadway improvements in the project area north of Interstate 10” to clarify that roadway improvements are consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose and Objective described and accepted in MIP Amendment #4, MIP Amendment #5, and MIP Amendment #6.

MDEQ received a comment requesting more information on Activity #38: Hancock County Fairground Revitalization Project Modification: Specify exactly what “new site facilities and upgrades/repairs” are intended to be made with the additional funds so the public can meaningfully comment and understand how these improvements will benefit the economy.

This activity was originally proposed on MIP Amendment #5 and included the Project Summary, Need, Purpose, Objective, Eligibility Criteria, Location, Budget, Milestones, Projected Completion Dates and Success Criteria. As stated in MIP Amendment #5, the project “will enhance site capacity improvements that include, but are not limited to, renovation of existing facilities, construction of on-site cottages and cabins, expansion of on-site

infrastructure of water, sewer, and electricity, and overall maintenance and improvement of existing site amenities such as the racetrack, stables, stage and dining areas, and grandstands”. On May 12, 2022, Treasury accepted MIP Amendment #5 confirming that MIP Amendment #5 was complete and conformed to the RESTORE Act and regulations. This MIP Amendment states that there is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #5. This MIP Amendment is adding funds to the previously accepted project as described and accepted in MIP Amendment #5. In response to this comment, MDEQ has revised the Project Modification to remove the word “additional” in order to clarify that the additional funds will support site capacity improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose and Objective described and accepted in MIP Amendment #5.

MDEQ received a comment requesting more information on Activity #41: The Kiln Utility and Fire District Water Infrastructure Expansion Project Modification: Specify exactly what infrastructure improvements are intended to be made and how this will benefit either the economy or the ecosystem.

This activity was originally proposed on MIP Amendment #6 and included the Project Summary, Need, Purpose, Objective, Eligibility Criteria, Location, Budget, Milestones, Projected Completion Dates and Success Criteria. As stated in MIP Amendment #6, the “anticipated activities include the installation of fire hydrants and 12” PVC waterline to replace existing 8” and 6” waterlines which do not provide the adequate capacity and fire protection for current and future development in the area project” and “Activities necessary to complete this proposed project may include, but are not limited to, engineering and design, permitting, construction site preparation, and construction. Other activities may be added/finalized with the grant application, after completion of engineering and design, or prior to requesting Notice to Proceed with construction from Treasury”. On May 2, 2023, Treasury accepted MIP Amendment #6 confirming that MIP Amendment #6 was complete and conformed to the RESTORE Act and regulations. This MIP Amendment states that there is no modification to the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, or Success Criteria as outlined and accepted in MIP Amendment #6. This MIP Amendment is adding funds to the previously accepted project as described and accepted in MIP Amendment #6. In response to this comment, MDEQ has revised the Project Modification to remove the word “additional” in order to clarify that the additional funds will support infrastructure improvements consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose and Objective described and accepted in MIP Amendment #6.

SECTION 2: GENERAL COMMENTS ON AMENDED MIP

MDEQ received a comment stating that the MIP does not meet the requirements outlined at 31 CFR 34.303(b), specifically 31 CFR 34.303(b)(1) “for each activity, the Multiyear Implementation Plan must include a narrative description demonstrating: the need for, purpose, and objectives of the activity;”.

The directions on this MIP form provided by Treasury say “Use this form for the Initial Multiyear Implementation Plan and any subsequent amendments to an accepted Multiyear Implementation Plan. For amendments, include only new and/or materially modified activities.” Treasury’s Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) dated December 2023, describes a material modification to a multiyear plan as “1) a change to the scope or size of the activity included in the multiyear plan that affects outcomes and/or outputs, and/or 2) a change in the overall Direct Component funds included in the multiyear plan resulting from the addition of a new activity or a change to the scope or size of an existing activity.” The FAQ further supports that an increase in funding to an existing project that does not affect the overall scope or objective for the activity described in the accepted MIP is considered a non-material change. MDEQ’s MIP Amendment #7 includes no new activities and twelve (12) modifications that describe changes to the project descriptions and/or Direct Component funding. For each of these activities, MIP Amendment #7 describes: 1) a change to the scope or size of the activity included in the multiyear plan that

affects outcomes and/or outputs, and/or 2) a change in the overall Direct Component funds included in the multiyear plan of an existing activity. As stated in each activity narrative in MIP Amendment #7, there is no modification to the need for, purpose, and objective of the twelve (12) activities; therefore, no such narrative is included in MIP Amendment #7. In response to this comment, MDEQ has revised the Project Modification of each of the twelve (12) activities to include a link to previously accepted MIP Amendments for ease of reference to previous narrative descriptions demonstrating the need for, purpose and objectives of each activity.

MDEQ received a comment opposing funding and modifications as presented in MIP Amendment #7 due to an established system and process that systematically excludes Black stakeholders input.

MDEQ disagrees with this accusation. The RESTORE Act provides that as a condition of receiving amounts from the Trust Fund, a Gulf Coast State shall, among other conditions, certify that the projects or programs for which the Gulf Coast State is requesting amounts was selected based on meaningful input from the public, including broad-based participation from individuals, businesses, and nonprofit organizations (33 USC 1321 (t)(1)(E)(ii)(III)).

Regarding public input, the RESTORE Act further states, "In meeting any condition of this paragraph, a Gulf Coast State may use an appropriate procedure for public consultation in that Gulf Coast State, including consulting with one or more established task forces or other entities, to develop recommendations for proposed projects and programs that would restore and protect the natural resources, ecosystems, fisheries, marine and wildlife habitats, beaches, coastal wetlands, and economy of the Gulf Coast." (33 USC 1321 (t)(1)(I)). Treasury's implementing regulations published at 31 CFR Part 34 outline the application procedure for Direct Component Funds saying "Before an eligible entity may receive a Direct Component activity grant, the grant applicant must submit a Multiyear Implementation Plan describing each activity for which it seeks funding under the Direct Component." (31 CFR § 34.303) Treasury's regulations go on to outline the required elements of a Multiyear Implementation Plan and describe the public review and comment requirement. The regulations state, "The plan was made available for public review and comment for a minimum of 45 days in a manner calculated to obtain broad-based participation from individuals, businesses, Indian tribes, and non-profit organizations; and Each activity in the plan was approved after consideration of meaningful input from the public. Treasury may require a standard format and additional information in the plans." (31 CFR 34.303(b)(8)-(9)) Treasury also acknowledges in section II of the preamble to 31 CFR Part 34 that the rule "does not require a state to ensure full participation in the public comment process. The rule is clear that a state must make its Multiyear Implementation Plan available for public review and comment 'in a manner calculated to obtain broad-based participation from individuals, businesses, Indian tribes, and non-profit organizations. . . .'" In this specific instance, the fact that the commenter, a self-identified minority member of the community, was able to comment on the MIP proves that MDEQ's public outreach process is meeting its intended purpose of a broad reaching a broad group of individuals in order to obtain "broad-based participation from individuals, businesses, and non-profit organizations." 33 USC 1321(t)(1)(E)(ii)(III).

As the entity identified in the RESTORE Act to carry out the duties of a Gulf Coast State, MDEQ utilizes various methods of public input designed to obtain broad-based participation from individuals, businesses, Indian tribes, and non-profit organizations. In April 2023, MDEQ issued a public "call for projects" soliciting project ideas from the public for funding consideration on this amended MIP. Governor Reeves utilized the Gulf Coast Advisory Committee to review projects and develop a recommendation for funding. The Gulf Coast Advisory Committee is made up of a diverse group of local community and business leaders, elected officials, non-project organizations, educational institutions, and state agencies, which was created by the Governor with the specific purpose of following RESTORE Act requirements for public input under 33 USC 1321(t)(1)(I). The Advisory Committee meetings were also publicly accessible via Facebook Live and archived on Facebook for later viewing. In October

2023, Governor Reeves held a press event to announce projects for this amended MIP. In November 2023, MDEQ held the 8th annual Restoration Summit which is open to the public and is free of charge. MDEQ was available to discuss the proposed MIP projects and a presentation was given describing the purpose, budget and anticipated qualitative benefit of each proposed project. The public was able to provide input at the Summit on everything that was presented, including the proposed projects. Vietnamese and Spanish translation services were also available at the Summit. When making the amended MIP available for public review and comment as prescribed by Treasury's regulations, MDEQ advertises the review and comment period in the two newspapers, via email blast and on MDEQ's website. The MIP Amendment is available in English, Spanish and Vietnamese, upon request, is available for immediate download via MDEQ's website, and is available via fax or hardcopy when requested. No revisions have been made to MIP Amendment #7 in response to this comment.

MDEQ received a comment stating that "MDEQ process fails to comply with the intended purpose and fails to provide qualitative and quantitative benefits of proposed use of funds".

MDEQ's MIP planning process is described in Mississippi's Initial MIP and subsequent MIP amendments, each of which has been deemed "complete" and confirmed to "conform to the RESTORE Act and regulations" by the U.S. Department of the Treasury. Additionally, MDEQ has received nine (9) grant awards and amendments to carry out MIP planning activities that are consistent with the Project Description, Need, Purpose, Objective, Location, Milestones, Success Criteria, and Project Budget of the Initial MIP and subsequent MIP amendments. Finally, the Objective statement for each activity in the MIP Amendment does provide qualitative benefits for each activity, and since there is no statutory requirement to describe quantitative benefits for activities in the MIP narrative, these benefits are established when negotiating a grant award with the U.S. Department of the Treasury.

In section II of the preamble to 31 CFR Part 34 Treasury states, "Several commenters asked Treasury to establish substantive criteria for evaluating project proposals, such as performance goals and preferences for certain kinds of activities. Other commenters proposed that Treasury adopt procedures, such as independent expert reviews, for evaluating synergies and potential conflicts between projects proposed under different components, or to address project proposals that may be controversial. Treasury considered similar comments during its review of comments on the proposed rule. The Act does not impose uniform criteria for the selection of projects under the Direct Component, Comprehensive Plan Component, and Spill Impact Component, or require the coordination of projects across components. Each component has different eligibility criteria, different processes for selecting activities, and different entities responsible for selecting the activities to be funded. The final rule acknowledges these differences, while still requiring compliance with the Act and Federal laws and policies applying to grants. Under these policies, Federal awards will include an indication of the timing and scope of performance, and may include specific performance goals, indicators, milestones, and expected outcomes. The appropriate vehicle for addressing these project specific requirements is the Federal award agreement." No revisions have been made to MIP Amendment #7 in response to this comment.

MDEQ received a comment stating that "MDEQ's implied "due diligence activities" were not specified (included), lacked meaningful public participation, access and transparency which is an eligibility criteria".

MIP Amendment #7 does in fact describe the due diligence activities MDEQ carried out for each project included in the MIP Amendment. Section 2 of MIP Amendment #7 states specifically that "MDEQ completed due diligence activities on each project to evaluate constructability, feasibility, logistics, eligibility determinations, and environmental compliance reviews to confirm recommended projects could be funded by the Direct Component of the RESTORE Act". The commenter is incorrect when stating that "meaningful public participation, access and

transparency” to MDEQ’s due diligence activities is an eligibility criteria. No revisions have been made to MIP Amendment #7 in response to this comment.

MDEQ received a comment encouraging future projects that achieve goals or outcomes of a state-produced climate action plan, restore the coast and make it more resilient in the face of sea level rise and climate change.

Each activity on the MIP meets one or more of the eligibility criteria available for funding under the Direct Component of the Resources and Ecosystems Sustainability, Tourist Opportunities, and Revived Economies of the Gulf Coast States Act (RESTORE Act) to support restoration activities as defined by the RESTORE Act and associated rules and regulations. MDEQ has and will continue to consider projects that that are eligible under the RESTORE Act that are submitted through the Mississippi Restoration Project Portal. No revisions have been made to MIP Amendment #7 in response to this comment.

MDEQ received a comment stating that the State of Mississippi should not spend restoration funds in categories that have little connection with the damage done to the ecosystem by the 2010 oil spill.

Each activity on the MIP meets one or more of the eligibility criteria available for funding under the Direct Component of the Resources and Ecosystems Sustainability, Tourist Opportunities, and Revived Economies of the Gulf Coast States Act (RESTORE Act) to support restoration activities as defined by the RESTORE Act and associated rules and regulations. After review, MDEQ believes there is sufficient detail in this MIP Amendment to demonstrate that the proposed activities are eligible. MDEQ has and will continue to consider projects that support local communities including workforce development and job creation, infrastructure benefitting the economy or ecological resources, and other eligible activities that are submitted through the Mississippi Restoration Project Portal. No revisions have been made to MIP Amendment #7 in response to this comment.
